

Global Scholarship Application Timeline

Rotarians recruit scholarship applicants	July through November 2013
Application deadline	November 15, 2013
Clubs interview applicants & make a recommendation	December 2, 2013
District interviews and selection of applicants	December 21, 2013
Candidates seek admission at institution of choice	December through February 2014
District submits the application of candidates with letter of admission to the Rotary Foundation for possible approval	March 1, 2014

District 6080 will select up to two qualified candidates to be recommended to The Rotary Foundation for approval. Once an applicant has been selected by the District Scholarship Committee, he/ she will immediately seek admission for graduate study at an institution of choice. After admission has been obtained, a letter of admission and a proposed course of study must be sent to the Chair of the District Scholarship Committee for submission to The Rotary Foundation, along with the candidate's application for consideration and approval for funding. Please note that funding is not granted until the candidate's scholarship application has been approved by The Rotary Foundation.

General Scholarship Highlights & Qualifications

• Applicants must complete a Global Grant Scholarship Application, which is available at Rotary6080.org, and submit it to a local Rotary Club where he/she has a legal residency or in his/her place of employment or current college enrollment.

• Scholarship study must take place in a foreign country.

• The scholar must be studying within one of the six (6) Areas of Focus established by The Rotary Foundation. • The academic program must be at the graduate level.

• The scholar must demonstrate that he/ she has already been accepted for study at the desired university abroad before District 6080 can submit the required Global Grant application to The Rotary Foundation for consideration.

• The applicant must complete a district authorized Rotary orientation seminar prior to departure for scholarship study.

• The scholar must begin his/her academic program by the approved 2014 academic date.

• The scholar may NOT be (1) a Rotarain; (2) an employee of a club, district or other Rotary entity, or of Rotary International; (3) the spouse, a lineal descendent (child or grandchild by blood or stepchild legally adopted or not), the spouse of a lineal descendent or an ancestor (parent or grandparent by blood) of any person in the foregoing two categories.

• The scholar must live in the immediate vicinity of the approved study institution in the host district so that he/she can participate in the Rotary club and district activities of the home district.

• Applications must be received by November 15, 2013
