How Did We Do Last Year?

Rotary International annual report 2012-13, a very good year for Rotary

The 2012-13 fiscal year was a very good one for Rotary, leaving it financially strong to do good in the world. Contributions to the Annual Fund set a new record, surpassing \$115.1 million. Donors also gave a record \$20.4 million to the Endowment Fund.

PolioPlus received \$23.6 million from Rotarians and friends of Rotary, along with \$69.6 million from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Rotary also geared up for the global launch of its new grant model. During the final year of the Future Vision pilot, 100 districts participated in projects supported by district grants and global grants totaling \$26.4 million.

How Are We Doing This Year?

As of February 2014 Annual Giving is up 8 percent world-wide (up 5.5 percent in North America) from this time last year, well toward our goal of \$120 Million.

Using Rotary Direct, 69 of District 6080 Rotarians contribute \$28,448 annually to the Foundation Annual Fund.

How Is District 6080 Doing This Year?

Annual Fund contributions are \$172,393 or \$61.86 per capita. We have 148 days remaining to reach \$300,000 and \$100+ per capita. We are ever so close; keep encouraging those around you and set the example of giving yourself.

To date 953 (34 percent) of our 2,785 members have given some amount to the Annual Fund. Of those 953 members, 614 (22 percent) members gave at a level of \$100 or more.

1832 (66 percent) of our members have yet to give, and 11 clubs have yet to send contributions.



India celebrates three years polio free

On Jan. 13, 2014, a significant milestone in the worldwide effort to eradicate polio was reached when India celebrated three years since its last new case of the disease. Official certification of the country as polio free will take place in March and a celebration is planned in February.

Long considered the hardest place in the world from which to eradicate polio, India is now a case study for mounting a successful disease response effort under complex circumstances. In 2009, India was home to almost half of the world's polio cases.
