Rotary Accomplishments

Before year-end 2014, the following grants had been awarded:

- 298 district grants totaling \$17.9 million, compared with 288 grants during the same period in 2013
- 386 global grants totaling \$23.7 million (\$9.9 million of that from the World Fund), compared with 209 grants during the same period in 2013—an 85 percent increase!

District 6080 received one of the 298 district grants in the amount of \$71,141. From that, \$58,500 was returned to 34 Rotary clubs in amounts ranging from \$500 to \$9,500, matching club's contributions funding District Simplified Grants. The Group Study Exchange Team to India was funded to \$12,000. The remaining \$641 is in contingency for unexpected needs.
